PBIS - Positive Behavior Intervention Supports

Each month we have featured new information about our school and district implementation of PBIS, or Positive Behavior Intervention and Supports. At the core of the the PBIS philosophy is the first word in it, Positive. Research proves that the best way to shape behavior and to make a successful school culture is through positive reinforcement. In prior articles we told you about our Power Paws, Golden Paws, and celebrations of positive choices. This month we'd like to share a bit about some of the ways that adults at school are actively involved in promoting good behaviors.

Systematic Supervision is a process used by our teachers and assistants during recess, lunch, and less structured times. Whereas past practices might have encouraged teachers to stay posted in a certain spot and observe the playground, Systematic Supervision encourages staff to be moving throughout the space, interacting with kids, and developing the positive relationships that maintain a safe and pleasant school culture. Teachers work to recognize positive choices being made by students and reward them, while still keeping a close eye on any undesirable behaviors and interrupting them before they become a bigger problem.

In essence one form of Systematic Supervision used in many classrooms is what's known as a good behavior game. Good behavior games engage students in a fun activity used to target specific behaviors the teacher wishes to see more of, including quick, motivating reward opportunities. An example might be an activity like behavior basketball in which a teacher identifies a target skill then gives students token pieces of paper each time they see it. At the end of an instructional time, the teacher might then allow students to crumple the paper and shoot for a basket. Not only are students rewarded with a quick break, but they might also earn a bonus prize for making a shot into the wastebasket. Games like this keep students focused on positive choices and break up the monotony of reviewing rules and expectations.

Finally with the help of our older students, this year Rockbrook has implemented Morning Announcements. During this time students might be reminded and recognized for positive choices in our school. It's one more way that we are working hard to make positive interactions a frequent and present part of student's efforts at Rockbrook.

Dancing Classrooms Begins

Rockbrook is excited to host its second year of the Dancing Classrooms program with our 5th grade students. Dancing Classrooms is a holistic approach to build confidence and teamwork, stretch creative skills, and support academic excellence, using the rich and varied vocabularies of social dance to increase cooperation, to improve concentration, and to explore areas of commonality, understanding and cultural awareness. Students develop skills of poise, confidence, teamwork, and working together in a partnership. We want to thank the Rockbrook Community Club, who along with a grant from the Westside Foundation, help to fund this beneficial program.



Cold Weather Policy

There are always questions from parents about when our students go outside in the cold weather. Our policy is the same for recess, safety patrol, and parking lot patrol —when the wind chill is 0 degrees or below, we stay inside, otherwise we go out. Rockbrook Community Club is made up of parents who come together to support our school. Being a part of Community Club provides a great opportunity for parents to be involved in their child's education, and to meet other parents and families.

Parent Advisory Group - Parents are a critical part of our team at Rockbrook, and your input on decisions that impact students and our community are important to us. The Rockbrook Parent Advisory Group meets monthly, in conjunction with the Rockbrook Community Club as well as a daytime meeting for those unable to attend at night. Our next meeting will be Tuesday, Feb. 7, at 2:00 pm and 6:00 pm. We hope you will be able to join us.

Student In-District Transfer Requests for the 2017-18 School Year

If you are a District resident who would like your K-5 child(ren) to attend an elementary school other than the school that serves your attendance area for next school year, you must submit a completed In-District Transfer (IDT) Request form to the Office of Student Services for review.

State law allows school districts to give transfer priority to families living within the District prior to placing Open Enrollment students who reside outside the District. We must receive a Student In-District Transfer Request form no later than 4:00 p.m. on March 15, 2017, for your request to be considered prior to our placement of Open Enrollment students.

IDT forms are available at the ABC Building and on the District website. An IDT request form must be completed for any child starting kindergarten next year who has one or more siblings currently attending a school outside their home attendance area. Transfers are approved or denied based on available space and other resources. If you have questions about the in-district transfer process, please call 402-343-2603.

Kindergarten Enrollment for District Residents: January 5-February 15

Do you live in the District and have a child who will be ready for Kindergarten this fall? Do you know of other Westside residents with children who will be ready to start school in August?

Kindergarten enrollment for 2017-18 begins January 10. Parents of eligible students should go to westside66.org to begin the enrollment process as early as possible.

Students entering kindergarten for 2017-18 must be five years old by July 31, 2017. Parents may opt to hold their children out of kindergarten for an additional year. However, Nebraska state law mandates that a child who reaches six years of age prior to January 1 of the then-current school year must be enrolled in school.

Requirements for Early Admission to Kindergarten

In accordance with Nebraska Statute 79-214, the Westside Community Schools allows for admission of children as early entrance kindergarteners through a locally designed testing program. Children of District residents who wish to be tested for early entrance must turn five between August 1 and October 15, 2017. For further information regarding early entrance to kindergarten, please call 402-390-2108.

Kindergarten Enrollment for Non-District Residents

If you live outside the District and have a child eligible for kindergarten who has a sibling currently attending a Westside elementary school through the Open or Option Enrollment program, you must submit an Option Enrollment Application. Option Enrollment Applications must be received by Westside's Office of Student Services no later than 4:00 p.m. on March 15, 2017. The application form is available at the ABC Building (909 S. 76th Street) and at westside66.org. Under Option Enrollment statutes, first priority for admission is given to siblings who seek to attend in the District where an older sibling is already enrolled, provided an Option Enrollment form is submitted by March 15 and provided that there is space available in a requested building and grade level.
